ISIL are known for using social media to radicalise and recruit vulnerable people and it enables them to reach a large pool of people worldwide. 



Most of the referrals were under 30yrs old and 45% were students.




These pictograms show the % of referred people that sought out the extremist content on purpose.



Why is this important?

This highlights how many referrals have been exposed to extremist content through social media. Social media paltforms have a huge audience so when extremists post videos or images they can access a huge number of people.

## The simple answer is: meta tags.

When a video is uploaded to YouTube, the author adds a title and description, but they can also add descriptive labels known as meta tags, which allow youtube to categorise the video and add it to relevant searches. By wrongly adding common tags to extremist videos, users can unintentionally be

recommended extremist material.
